Re: Industry-Wide Bargaining manuscript

In addition to this galley, which is our file copy, there are attached:

1. The author's alterations as he indicated them on the first galley.
2. The new galleys. I have read these personally, and I am as certain as I can be that we have made every change Leo Wolman indicated. (I am a frail human, but I'll post a bond on this.)

In addition, the new galleys have been read by (1) me and (2) a professional proofreader for typos., style, etc. Our two or three changes, all typographical, are noted on the author's corrected galleys. I see no reason why Leo Wolman, or Miss Ehrenreich, should re-read the galleys, unless he wants to make further editorial changes. Heaven forbid, because if he does this, all chances of meeting the delivery date are forever lost. (The compositors have already given me considerable gratuitous (straight-rate) night work, but they are fast losing interest.)

The portion which you and I discussed is marked on galley 5 of this set. I think it can be deleted with no loss whatever.
