Dear Wesley Riddle:

Professor Semholz of Grove City College has forwarded to us your letter to him of October 5. We really have nothing to add to what Mr. Read wrote you on October 12.

We hope that you may be able to word your brief so that proposals for an acting legislation to repeal present interferences with the market may be interpreted as "establishing" a free market program leaving individuals free to make their own plans is the best and only way the government can encourage free enterprise successfully. The problem when government officials presume to plan production themselves is that they cannot begin to anticipate what everyone in the country is doing with respect to energy. See Brian Summers' "What Government Officials Cannot Know" in the enclosed (July 1978) Freeman, as well as my article, "Energy in a Changing World," in the September issue which was included in the materials Mr. Read sent you.
