

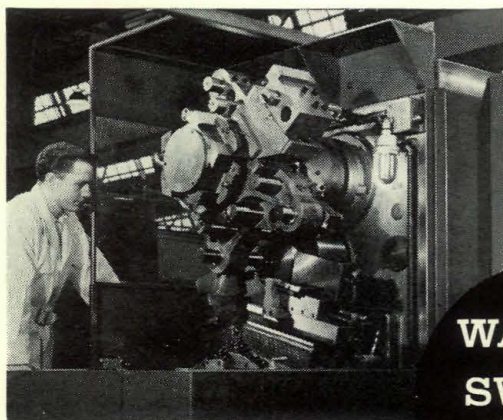
It wasn't the Goths that defeated Rome—
