

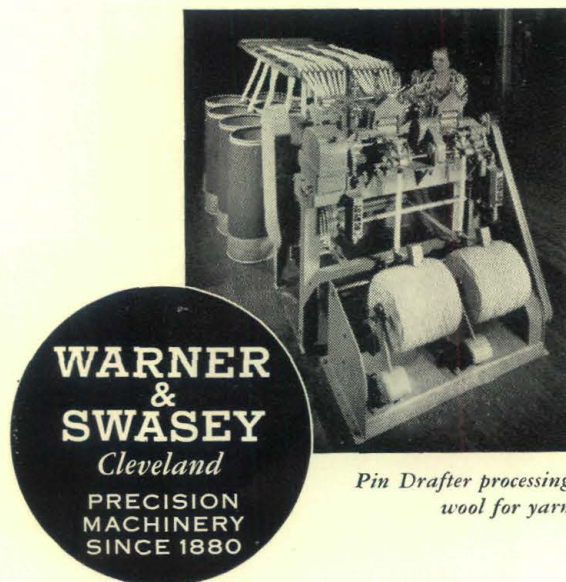
“Friendly” government vs. “selfish” business
