Dear Fellow American and/or Supporter: Do you know that Walter Reuther already has a hard core of 150 to 175 Congressmen whose elections he helped finance with union funds, and who are, therefore, expected to vote as he dictates?

Do you know that he now plans to enter 300 Congressional Districts with candidates of his own choosing? And that he expects, with the power of his union money to elect 220 of them, which will give him absolute control of the lower House of Congress and the opportunity to dictate what legislation will be considered and passed? If Reuther succeeds, it will have a profound effect on your way of life.

Right now, Reuther is pushing the Forand Bill, written with the aid of A. F. L. - C. I. O., that will put the medical costs of many into Social Security and open the door wide for socialized medicine, which British trades unions established.

We must raise quickly a \$250,000 seed money fund so that, backed by twenty years of experience, the know how, and possession of the most effective material, we can fight in all these districts, in which we have supporters and lists of leadership individuals. Honorable and Dear Sir:

It is reported that A. F. L. - C. I. O. this year will enter 300 or more Congressional Districts in an effort to elect 220 "friendly" legislators in the House...enough to control and decide the fate of legislation presented to that body.

"Should they succeed," says Ray Tucker in his release for the McClure Newspaper Syndicate, "the next Congress will be an A. F. L. - C. I. O. annex."

What must be done immediately is to ready material that, at low cost, can be distributed in every district where A. F. L. - C. I. O. attempts to elect men who will be responsive to its demands. It will take 3 million of each piece of material to cover the 10,000 leadership individuals in each of the 300 districts.

Hitler, while destroying the German states and centralizing all power in himself, said, "It gives us special, secret pleasure to realize that the businessmen of Germany are not aware of what is happening to them." Americans are unaware of the extent to which Reuther has already gained control of our Federal Government.

We have the material from pieces mentioned in the attached statement, twenty years of experience, a record of success, and the ability to do the job that now must be done. We have a definite program, part of which is mentioned in the enclosure. But we must quickly have a seed money fund of \$250,000 to carry through effectively. To raise this fund, the immediate help of many is needed. In the struggle against Court-packing, 12,000 contributed average amounts of less than \$20 each.

Donald R. Richberg, a longtime friend of labor, says, "The labor movement has now become a political movement with the objective of establishing a socialist labor government in control of the economic and social life of the nation."
