September 18, 1951.

I have followed with great interest the work of the Committee for Constitutional Government, and particularly Dr. King's research and testimony before Congressional committees. Dr. King has rendered valuable service by his exhaustive studies which prove that taxes taking more than 25% of a man's income, or more than 45% of the upper marginal incomes, kills off risk-taking investment and causes the incomes of groups so taxed to shrink so that no greater revenue is secured by the government.


Dr. King set forth these results in testimony before the Senate Finance Committee and more exhaustively to the House Ways and Means Committee, and in installments of the SPOTLIGHT news weekly. The soundness of Dr. King's conclusions is borne out by my own observations with respect to the attitude and course of action of those of large income and consequent high taxes, over a period of more than thirty years.

Robert B. Dresser, also a trustee of the Committee for Constitutional Government, has written the resolution passed by many states, demanding a limitation on federal taxing power, and has been a leader, giving time and money to this work.

It is in the best interest of all industrial workers, all stockholders, and of all citizens who profit by a dynamic, expanding economy, to have the educational work for sound tax policy that will not destroy incentive and that will encourage maximum production, carried through on such a program as the Committee of Twenty-Five recommends.

I have read with interest "SPOTLIGHT for the Nation" and have personally paid for 1,000 \$10 subscriptions. I suggest that you and your associates give careful consideration to the "Call to All Freedom-Loving Americans..." by the Committee of Twenty-Five.
