Your plant has been suggested to us as a suitable one for producing a book we wish to reprint. A copy of the book is attached. We would be interested in having your figures on the job. The specifications are as follows:

Title: THE MAINSPRING OF HUMAN PROGRESS  
Quantity: 10,000 and 20,000  
Pages: 280 pages and cover  
Composition: to be entirely reset in same type as sample (which I believe is 10/13 Caledonia) exactly page for page (it is used with a study guide which gives specific page references)  
Stock: Inside: 50 lb. Warren's #66 (anyother suggestion?)  
Cover: 80 lb. white antique Tuscan Cover, or equivalent  
Presswork: Inside: black  
Cover: green on outside, and blind scored for binding  
Binding: Smythe sewn in 32's, cover glued, trimmed flush to bleed

It would probably be advisable to have electros made. (The original edition ran into something like 250,000 copies. Since the Foundation took it over we have run over 30,000.) Would you please indicate the extra cost involved?

We would also like to know what delivery you could give us.
