This is to announce that Murray N. Rothbard will conduct a series of Tuesday evening seminars on "Free Market Economics: An Introduction" in New York City beginning October 16, 1973.

Each Tuesday evening session will consist of a one hour lecture by Dr. Rothbard, followed by discussion around the following topics:

This seminar series will require no background in economics, and is intended to serve as an introductory course for students, businessmen, writers, teachers in non-economic fields, and anybody else interested in understanding the functioning of the free market, and how to deal with the arguments commonly advanced by its opponents.

The first session begins at 7:30 P.M., Tuesday, October 16, continuing weekly with a three week break at Christmas. The concluding session will be held on February 19. The sessions will be held in Manhattan, and the exact address will be sent upon receipt of payment. Attendance will be limited to the first 15 persons whose checks are received.

The cost for the entire 16 sessions is \$60 if paid in four equal installments on the first days of October, November, December and January. A 20% discount will be allowed for prepayment (in the amount of \$48) by October 1.
