Thank you for your two manuscripts, "Looking Back" and "Unemployment in College Textbooks."

These are two excellent papers. Unfortunately, however, I doubt if either is quite right for The Freeman.

"Looking Back" is a superb speech, but as an article I think it has some difficulty standing alone before an American audience. I am afraid that U.S. readers would not see the connections among Nazism, Marxism, and U.S. interventionism. Perhaps it would be best to include it in a book along the lines of Clarence Carson's World in the Grip of an Idea.

"Unemployment in College Textbooks" is a fine concluding chapter to your book on labor and unemployment. However, I think it is best for The Freeman to focus on the economics and ethical issues involved in unemployment, as you did in your excellent Freeman series, rather than what various textbooks say on the subject. Perhaps this would be more suitable to an academic journal like Modern Age, or a journal on labor economics.

Thanks again for sharing your work. Please keep us in mind for future articles.
