THE HISTORICAL SETTING OF THE AUSTRIAN SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS

LUDWIG VON MISES is an economist and philosopher of international renown. Born and educated in Austria-Hungary, he taught economics for many years at the University of Vienna. Fleeing from Nazi persecution in 1934, he became a professor at the Graduate School of International Studies in Geneva, Switzerland. Since then, Dr. Mises has frequently lectured at universities in Great Britain, the Netherlands, France, Italy, Guatemala, Mexico, Peru, Argentina and the United States. Presently he is a visiting professor at the Graduate School of Business Administration at New York University.

Dr. Mises, foremost student of Eugen von Boehm-Bawerk, is in turn the teacher of many eminent economists including F. A. von Hayek, Henry Hazlitt, Israel Kirzner, Murray Rothbard, Hans Sennholz and Percy Greaves. Today, he is the acknowledged head of the Austrian School of Economics founded by Karl Menger.

Dr. Mises' most important books are *Human Action*, *Socialism* and *Omnipotent Government*. Other works by Mises include *Bureaucracy*, *Theory And History*, *Theory Of Money And Credit*, *Planning For Freedom*, *The Anti-Capitalist Mentality*, *Epistemological Problems Of Economics*, *The Ultimate Foundation Of Economic Science* and *Free And Prosperous Commonwealth*.
