What I have in mind is the information relative to the death rate of infants, something like 11 for one preceding the industrial revolution in England, and the dates between which the population grew from about 20 to 50 million. As you well know, the sweat shops and the "horrible" conditions in the urban areas in that period are almost inevitably pointed to in any extended discussion of limited government, so a few facts are mighty handy to use.
